**EARLY BEGINNINGS-CALGARY PENSIONER ASSOCIATION - Part 2**

After the first Membership meeting, there was a lot of work left to do. The executive would have an Executive meeting where plans were made which were then presented to the membership, and motions were made, seconded and voted on. Plans were needed for the asking for rooms, both for the executive meetings and the larger facilities for the general membership.

The executive were able to use smaller room/s such as the Herald Board Room, Naturally, the Executive would approach the Company for larger rooms such as The Crystal Ballroom, the East Room of the Palliser Hotel, and the Gas Company Auditorium.

An attempt was made to get the local Freight Agent to use their rooms as clubrooms. The Agent was "very cooperative but that satisfactory conditions were not possible. Membership was expanded to include the Alberta District, (until such time as each terminal has enough members to form their own association.) Discussions were held concerning admitting other Railway retirees, (not CP). It was common after general and Executive meetings to show "Moving Pictures" with subjects such as Royal Tours, Trips across Canada, Alaska, Fishing, and wartime films about the Inland Sea, Trooping the Colours, and the Battle of Britain.

A Sick visiting group was set up with 3 execs. One of their first questions was "Who would get the cigarettes and flowers to take while visiting. They wrestled with methods to notify the members of the general meetings. They tried to get the hotel to allow for a particular date each month but were unsuccessful. The executive was to produce a Draft Constitution for the Association. At the October 22, 1952 meeting it was suggested that a General Membership "party" be held to which the ladies would be invited. This would be on Dec 17, ended up on the 19<sup>th</sup>. The president offered to bring ice cream, and the Secretary said he would arrange with the Passenger Dept. For Moving Pictures, some they hadn't used before. The Executive are expected to make arrangements for a "pleasant afternoon.

Mr Switzer, a Minister from a downtown church would be asked to speak at November Meeting. At the Nov. Meeting Mr. Switzer's topic was "What Price World Peace?" (It still appears to be a good topic today.) The December Membership Meeting, (Party) on the 19<sup>th</sup>, was well attended. The Genl. Superintendent W. Mayne spoke about what great employees the Pensioners were in keeping the railway operating in the past. A Miss Helen de Caux gave several lovely solos accompanied by Miss Joyce Hackett. A quartet of CPR Employees male voices gave selections of songs, which was well received and given "a big applause. "The Secretary, Fred Hunt, was thanked and given a presentation for his services.

A film of the Coronation of Queen Elizabeth was then shown. Refreshments were served by Mrs. W. Kay and her committee. Everyone agreed that a pleasant afternoon was had.
