CSRS volunteers provide escorted transportation for seniors who are not able to use public transportation and require assistance during medical and banking appointments. The escorted transportation program is provided to help seniors to maintain their independence.

Bylaw Committee Bill Benner conducted the by-law amendments session. The following by-laws were abolished, "The Ways and Means Committee", and the "The Membership Committee". Other Bylaws were amended; they were the Quorum by law, changing a Quorum from 6 directors to 5 directors. Also the by-law regarding the Secretary Treasure had an addition added to include the work of the abolished Membership Committee.

President Ken Brown honoured 2 of our retiring Board members Les Davis and Charlie Belch for their past work for the Association. Each was presented with beautiful engraved clocks and Alva Belch was presented with flowers.

We had a report from NACPP by representative, Lyle Berge and a report from our new interim Pensioners Representative Robert Cameron. Our pension increase for the year 2013 will be \$15.00 per month. The pension reserves appear to be doing well and the company has topped off the pension fund as required by law by about 2 billion dollars.

An excellent lunch was prepared and served by our capable ladies in the kitchen; the lunch consisted of lasagne with salad and cake for dessert.
