

## Blue Cross Update

Blue Cross forms are on order, There may be a small delay responding to requests for them

Ambulance: - The City of Winnipeg does not accept Private coverage. Only cheque, cash or Credit Card. Blue Cross will reimburse 80 (eighty) percent of the cost, up to the two hundred (200) dollar limit, upon receipt of the completed form, with receipt (proof of payment.)
Physiotherapy – Blue Cross will cover charges if treatment is received from a private Clinic. If performed in a hospital, Manitoba Health pays the charges.

President's News Letter July 20, 2021.

Greetings from the National Council of Canadian Pacific Pensioners Associations (NCCPPA). In accordance with the NCCPPA by laws article VIII Section 1, I am here by submitting my First Activities Report of 2021. In addition to the continuation of some of the past initiatives, below I have listed some activities that we have undertaken.

Continue working with Perkopolis Account Manager to coordinating the process of registration/log in for their discount programs for the interested NCCPPA Member Associations.

For the periods January 1<sup>st</sup> to March 31, 2021 and April 1<sup>st</sup> to June 30, 2021 distributed among the member chapters, the lists of the recent CP Pensioners who have provided consents to NCCPPA. The officers at the local chapters should contact these pensioners in their respective areas to informing them of their association's contacts, membership processes, activities as well as programs.

In consultation with NCCPPA Treasurer Don Jennings and members of the executive committee, reinvested one of the GIC for a period of 14 months at 0.50% return.

Coordinated the distribution of CP Magazines to the Local CP Pensioners Associations.

Replied to various inquiries from the retirees and survivors.

In collaboration with Bob Cameron, Pensioners Representative and Secretary NCCPPA reviewed and provided comments to CP Railway on the distribution processes of the 2021 Rocky Mountaineer - CP Rail Retirees discounts program.

As you are aware that Covid -19 restrictions and lock downs are cautiously alleviated by the authorities, members of the organizing committee at CP Pensioners Association London, Ontario are re-evaluating the scheduling of NCCPPA Triennial Convention. They are anticipating to arranging the Convention possibly by the end of May 2022 provided it is safe to do so. We will inform all NCCPPA member chapters once the decision is concluded.
