

Blue Cross Update I Blue Cross advises following changes to covering rates for Canadian Pacific Group NO. 93100 the Pensioners Health Plan : - The rates for 2022 have been reduced by 12.5%, effective January 1st, 2022. The single rate will be \$28.94 and the family rate \$57.85 per month. - NOTE: widows under Blue Cross come under "The Old Plan". Their rates for 2022 also went down12.5%. The single rate is now \$95.03 and the family rate \$190.04 per month, Blue cross advise claims should be submitted in a timely matter as you incur expenses. To help you do this there are different options that allow you to proceed simply and quickly. - Prescription drugs: By presenting your Blue Cross ID Card to your pharmacist, Blue Cross will immediately pay the eligible portion (80%) of your prescription. You will only have to pay the difference. I- Self serve tools (new for 2021-2022.) By logging into Blue Cross's member portal at www.medavibec.ca or on I Medivaie Mobile App, you will be able to submit a claim online and avoid mailing the costs and delays. Moreover, by signing up for Direct Deposit, Blue Cross will deposit your claims reimbursements direct into your bank account. Expenses incurred in **2021** must be received at Blue Cross no later than March 31, 2022.
