It has been a while since we communicated about the NCCPPA Convention tentatively rescheduled for May 27 & 28, 2022 in London Ontario. Common terms with railroad origins

<u>BAND WAGON</u>—on the popular or apparently winning circle, as in an election. – A band wagon was the pay car or pay train from which wages were handed out to railroad employees.

<u>BELLS AND WHISTLES</u>—*doing something in a big way.* – from railroad use of whistle signals and bells to communicate.

DEADBEAT—one who persistently fails to pay his debts or way. - coined in the late 1800's when railroad workers noticed that loaded freight cars made a different beat over the track-joints than cars that weren't carrying a load. The empty cars made a "dead beat" indicating they weren't paying their way. By the beginning of the 20th century "deadbeat" came to encompass people who failed to carry their share of the load.
