Greetings from your Pensioners Executive:

A little background of the Pensioners Club beginnings:

On May 19th, 1952, a dinner for CP Pensioners was held at the Palliser Hotel, Calgary hosted by the Company CP Officers Association. 325 pensioners attended. Mr. N.R. Crump, Senior Vice President congratulated and thanked the pensioners for helping to "build the Company to the high position it holds today and across the years."

A meeting was held after dinner to call for the formation of a pensioners association for social and friendly meetings among pensioners. On June 17<sup>th</sup>, 1952, it was reported that 250 men had signed up in favor of a pensioner's association. The first meeting of the membership was held on July 17<sup>th</sup>, 1952, in the East Dining room of the Palliser Hotel. The first group of pensioners was made up to 30 running trades, 14 telegraph, 14 Dining Car, 4 Police, 10 Express and 6 Palliser.

From those humble beginnings came the start of the Calgary CP Pensioners Association. We are the only group of railway pensioners in the system to have dedicated clubrooms. Ours are in Building 10 at the Ogden Shops. The facilities are paid for by the Company i.e., water, electricity, etc. Each month from September to June, a lunch has been provided to members by a dedicated group of CP ladies for a cost of \$5 until the time of Covid when the Club rooms were closed.

We are looking forward to being able to open these clubrooms as Covid restrictions are lifted and enjoy getting together again. Please watch for a possible reopening soon, Your Executive look forward to meeting all our old members and welcoming new members.
